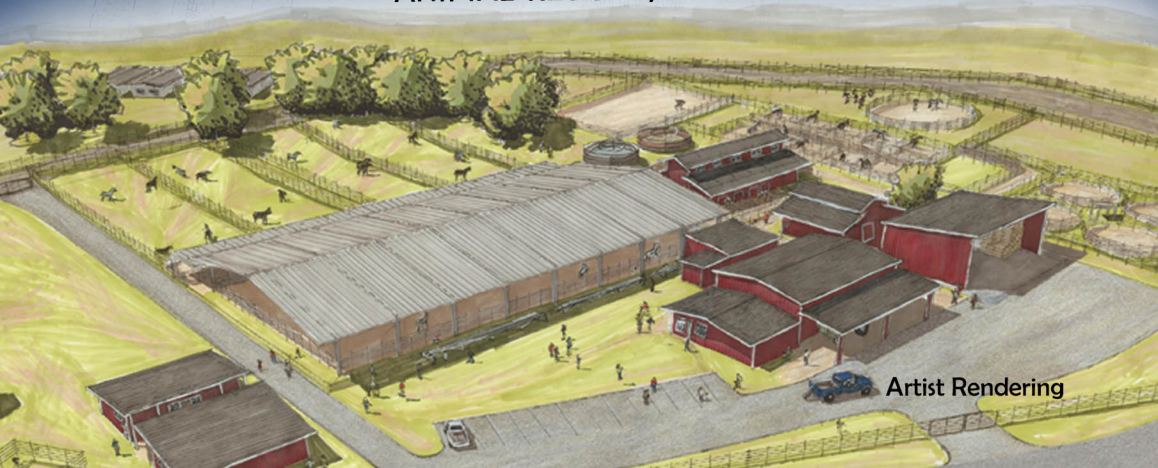


# RESCUE Rehabilitate REHOME

**A**ll About Equine Animal Rescue, Inc. has been rescuing, rehabilitating, and rehoming horses since 2009. Operating on family property, we have always known our efforts and success would one day exceed our facility's capacity. What started as a small endeavor has grown into a thriving, community based organization that has served over 260 horses, of which more than 195 have been adopted, maintaining an overall adoption rate of about 75%

**RASCAL** Just hours old, Rascal's mom scaled a six foot paddock and left her behind. She was weak and couldn't stand on her own. With the love and care of 100's of AAE Volunteer hours, Rascal today stands healthy and ready for a new home.



**A**s All About Equine has evolved, it has become not just about helping horses, but also about helping humans. Our horses have participated in a variety of programs for Veterans, at-risk youth, developmentally disabled youth and adults, foster children, adults and more. Program participants and many of our volunteers have experienced loss, depression, recovery from addiction, cancer treatment, family challenges, self-confidence issues, and similar life challenges.

In 2017, All About Equine was blessed with a bittersweet gift from the estate of Sandra Fields. With this estate gift, we were able to invest in AAE's future by acquiring 61 acres in Pilot Hill. In collaboration with the El Dorado Community Foundation, All About Equine is undertaking our most significant fundraising endeavor to date, a capital campaign to support development of a new facility on this property.

Our goal is to develop a facility where All About Equine can grow roots and become not only a facility for rescuing, rehabilitating, and rehoming horses in need, but a venue to facilitate training and education, a center that brings the community together to focus on serving horses and humans.

All About Equine has strong financial management and is rated as a Platinum Level Nonprofit on Guide Star. A current IRS Form 990 financial statement is available upon request.
